




Wind, Percussion, and Drum Major Uniform Care

Our Fred J Miller band uniforms are performance wear made for easy care, comfort and durability.

Proper care is imperative with any garment.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!



DO.....

- ✓ Ask question before you start
- ✓ Use only non-chlorine household detergent
- ✓ Use warm or cold water
- ✓ Wash items separately
- ✓ Wash similar items together if you have more than one child in band (2 jackets in one load is okay)

DO NOT.....

- ✓ DO NOT....Use hot water or hot air on uniform
- ✓ DO NOT....Use fabric softener or dryer sheets
- ✓ DO NOT....Wash with other clothes
- ✓ DO NOT....Wash bib (pants) and jackets together
- ✓ DO NOT....DRY CLEAN any part of the uniform

Before you wash your uniform:

- 1) Remove the Brocade from the jacket –You will NOT wash the Brocade!
- 2) Velcro the gauntlets together
- 3) Write down the exact snap that is fastened in the jacket and bib
- 4) Unsnap the cuff in the wrist of the jacket and ankle of bib
- 5) Zip the jacket up

When you wash your uniform:

- 6) Prepare to run 2-cycles through a standard washing machine
 - a. Load #1 Jacket and Gauntlets
 - b. Load #2 Bib (pants)
- 7) Use NON-CHLORINE, household detergent only with NO SOFTENER ADDED!!
- 8) Place the Jacket and Gauntlets in the washer.
- 9) Run on the Gentle cycle with warm water. DO NOT WASH USING HOT WATER!!
- 10) Place the uniform in a dryer on a COOL or PERMANENT PRESS cycle
- 11) Repeat the Process for the bib

When you uniform is dry:

- 12) Reattach the Brocade (WHICH WAS NOT WASHED. If Stained contact Mr. Keech)
- 13) Re-snap the cuffs in the sleeves of the jacket and ankles of the bibs
- 14) Rehang the uniform and load the uniform AND GAUNTLETS into you garment bag.

Quick Reference Stain Guide

Blot stains with water or cleaners.... DO NOT RUB!!

PRE TREAT STAINS BEFORE WASHING (apply stain treatment and scrub with a soft toothbrush)



"Lestoil" - will take out most stains



"Simple Green" – For hard to remove grass stains or dirt rings on collars and sleeves.

For all other stain types contact Mr. Keech for a recommendation.
