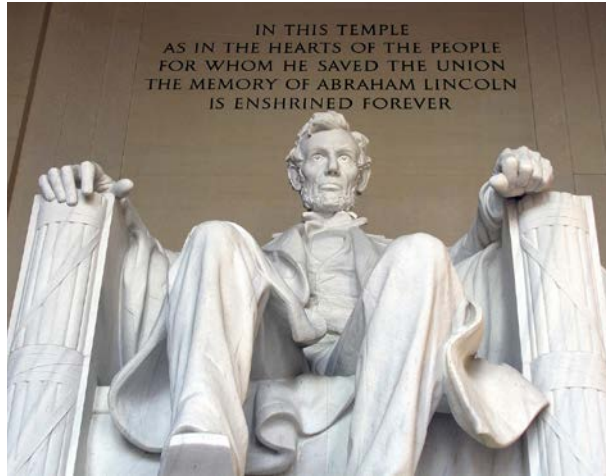


Nick Visits the Lincoln Memorial


