
Classroom Translator for Enhanced Engagement

Within Arlington Central School District, our mission includes fostering learning opportunities through the use of innovative technology. We are seeking to purchase 7 Pocketalk translation devices for use by our ENL students. To facilitate equal access to education, wearable translators could empower non-English learners and enhance their ability to engage effectively in educational settings by having instant translation of classwork in their native language. Students will use this two-way translation device to engage in full conversations with teachers and classmates as well as translate written text using the built in camera.

Professional Learning

Continued focus on Professional Learning Communities work.

- ACSD Faculty and Administration will have participated in 17 virtual and 5 onsite professional learning experiences by the end of 2024-2025. Similar number next year.

Significantly reduced outside consultants for the 2025-2026 school year.

Continuing teacher lead PD, and expanding to include in-district microcredentials.

Three new courses (WC Marketing, Auto Build, Visual Communications) at AHS which create opportunities for two new CTE pathways.



Anticipated Cost of Curriculum Writing

Between new course development, curriculum and assessment updates, and textbook alignment - the anticipated expense of curriculum writing for the 2025-2026 School Year is approximately \$52,800.

Most of this expense can be covered with Title II funds.

Individual Arts Assessment Pathway

Applying in the spring of 2025 for implementation in the 2025-2026 School year.

The Individual Arts Assessment Pathway is 4+1 graduation pathway option in which students complete a locally determined three-unit sequence in the arts and demonstrate, through a collection of creative works, growth over time that meets the High School II Accomplished Performance Indicators in the New York State Learning Standards for the Arts and offers arts students a graduation pathway that prepares them for future professional and educational experiences and opportunities in the arts.


