

- **Style and Language**

The book has a range of words that are easy and challenging words, a range of short and long sentences.

Ex 1: (Page 5) “There were pirates on the prow” is an example of more challenging words because the author used prow as opposed to the pirates are out.

Ex 2: “Officer Murphy led those greedy Pie rats away.” here they used the word greedy instead of those rats that stole the pie.

- **Characters**
