Reading

This week's reading lessons focused on: - identifying nonfiction TEXT FEATURES in texts we are reading together and independently

- RESPONDING to nonfiction (sticky note thoughts)

- talking LONG AND STRONG about texts we are reading independently

- identifying the MAIN IDEA and

DETAILS within short nonfiction reading passage about earthworms

We have compared this to when we were writing paragraphs and needed a "green" TOPIC SENTENCE (main idea) and "yellow" SUPPORTING DETAILS (details). All of the details need to relate to the main idea.

<u>Math</u>

This week's math lessons included: - 5 different ways to represent 2-digit numbers using standard form (43), tens and ones, drawing blocks, expanded form (40+3), and words (forty-three) - problem-solving using place value blocks - various ways to represent the same 2digit number using blocks 43 could be :

43 could be : 4 tens 3 ones 3 tens 13 ones 2 tens 23 ones 1 ten 33 ones 0 tens 43 ones

practicing our skip counting with a fun version of "hot and cold" as we guided friends to find our stuffed Humphrey in the classroom! Try it at home! ©

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<u>Writing</u>

This week's writing lessons focused on: - "squeezing our brains" for more information to teach our readers in our nonfiction books (we are teachers and we can't just share one fact for each section of our books!)

using nonfiction text features in our own nonfiction books

- using mentor texts (other authors' books) as a guide to what we want to include in our own books

Science / Social Studies
